



BYZANTINE-KYÏVAN LITURGICAL CALENDAR AM 7535 / AD 2026/27

GLORY TO JESUS CHRIST! The Society of Saint John Chrysostom liturgical calendar conveniently lists the feasts, fasts and liturgical readings for each day of the year according to the Kyïvan recension of the Byzantine rite, as celebrated by the Ukrainian Greek Catholic Church (UGCC). It is presented according to the Gregorian calendar and Paschalion, as in the Eparchy of the Holy Family of London and many other places in the Ukrainian diaspora.

As with all Christian calendars, the Byzantine calendar follows the movements and rhythms of Creation along two intersecting cycles: lunar and solar. The former revolves around Pascha, the great feast of feasts, while the latter is bookended by the equinox and solstice of the Incarnation: the Annunciation and the Nativity, both of which have served as New Year's Day at various times and places in European history. These cycles are reflected in the two sets of readings for each day of the year: one moveable and one fixed. In some traditions it is customary to chant both sets of readings at the Divine Liturgy each day but, as this is generally done in the UGCC only for feasts ranked *Polyelos* and above, we have reflected this as the option in our listings. Likewise, days with feasts ranked *Vigil* and above are generally listed without the moveable readings of the day, owing to the dignity of the feast, except on Sundays. And, unlike the Roman rite, the Byzantine year begins, not on the first Sunday of Advent, but on 1 September, which was New Year's Day in the Byzantine Empire from 537 to 1453.

The Holy, Catholic and Apostolic Church is at once universal, particular and local, and this is reflected in the variety of feasts in this calendar. Most great feasts of our Lord and the Mother of God are universal and well known to Latin Catholics and Christians of other traditions. Many of the feasts listed derive from the Great Church of Constantinople, from which the Metropolis of Kyïv sprang; others come from the shared tradition of Kyïvan Rus', while some are unique to the UGCC. In transliterating their Greek and Slavic names we have sought to strike a balance between authenticity and legibility while, for biblical personages, the common English forms have been retained. The months are given in English with the *Anno Domini* year, and in Church Slavonic with the *Anno Mundi* year in Cyrillic numerals.

Finally, a word about fasting, as practice differs in the East and West. In Latin Christianity the obligation to fast has been penitential in nature and enforced 'on pain of sin'. In recent times it has been relaxed or adapted to different circumstances across the world and society. In Byzantine Christianity fasting is traditionally more extensive and frequent, but understood as an ideal towards which to strive. In both traditions fasting, taken together with prayer and almsgiving, helps us to conquer our passions and advance on the path to union with God, or *theosis*. The fasting rule used in this calendar is drawn from the Typikon of Venerable Sabbas the Sanctified, which remains the primary point of reference for East Slavic liturgical life. The rule prescribes *xerophagy* ('dry

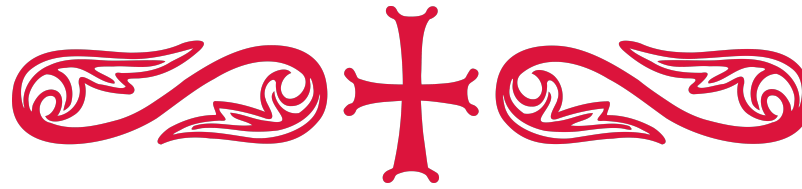
eating') for most Wednesdays and Fridays of the year, in which no meat, eggs, dairy, fish, oil or wine are consumed, and nothing at all until the evening meal, or at least until the ninth hour (around 3pm). This is also observed daily throughout the Great Fast (Lent), the Apostles' Fast, the Dormition Fast and the Nativity Fast, although fish, oil and wine are permitted on certain days, depending on the feast and season. The rule is austere and rarely observed in its entirety, but is included here as a 'gold standard' from which we can adapt our practice to account for personal circumstances, health, and spiritual development.

The minimum fasting rule, to which Ukrainian Greek Catholics are bound, is governed according to canon 115 of the Particular Law of the UGCC. As there is yet no official translation of this canon into English, we have attached an unofficial translation as an appendix. It proscribes meat products on most Fridays of the year; on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays of Lent, the entire first week and Holy Week; and Wednesdays and Fridays of the Apostles' and Dormition fasts, as well as various days throughout the year.

Christ tells us to show joy when we fast, so we should avoid being pharisaical and remember that 'the letter kills, but the Spirit gives life' (2 Cor. 3:6) and 'abstinence from food by itself is insufficient for praiseworthy fasting...shunning vices makes fasting good' (Saint Basil the Great, *Homily II on Fasting*). Equally, however, 'the more you deny the flesh, the more you render the soul radiant with spiritual health.' (*Ibid.*) ✠

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APPENDIX A: CANON II5 OF THE PARTICULAR LAW OF THE UGCC

§ 1. The penitential practice of fasting, repentance, and abstinence, the purpose of which is to make amends for sins committed and to attain greater perfection for the sake of personal sanctification, is the oldest tradition of the Ukrainian Greek Catholic Church.

§ 2. All the faithful are obliged to fast during the following periods of the church year: the Great Fast [Lent] and Holy Week; Peter's Fast – from the Monday after All Saints' Sunday until the eve of the feast of the Holy Chief Apostles Peter & Paul (inclusive); the Dormition Fast, or the Saviour's Fast, – from the feast of the Transfer of the Honourable and Life-giving Cross and the Maccabean Martyrs, Salome, their mother, and the elder Eleazar, until the eve of the Dormition of the Most Holy Theotokos (inclusive); the Nativity Fast, or Philip's Fast – from the day after the feast of the Apostle Philip until the eve of the Nativity of Christ:

1. on the first day of the Great Fast and Good Friday – strict fasting, meaning one should refrain from eating meat and dairy products and eggs, as well as dishes containing these products;
2. during the first week of the Great Fast and throughout all days of Holy Week, one must abstain from consuming meat products and dishes;

3. on Monday, Wednesday, and Friday of the other weeks of the Great Fast, one should refrain from consuming meat products and dishes; on Tuesday and Thursday, all types of food are permitted;

4. during other fasts of the church year, the faithful are obliged to: abstain from consuming meat products and dishes on Wednesday and Friday; all types of food are permitted on Monday, Tuesday, and Thursday.

§ 3. All the faithful are obliged to observe a fast on the following days: the eve of the Nativity of Christ, the eve of the Theophany of the Lord, the Beheading of the Honourable Head of Saint John the Baptist, and the Universal Exaltation of the Honourable and Life-giving Cross.

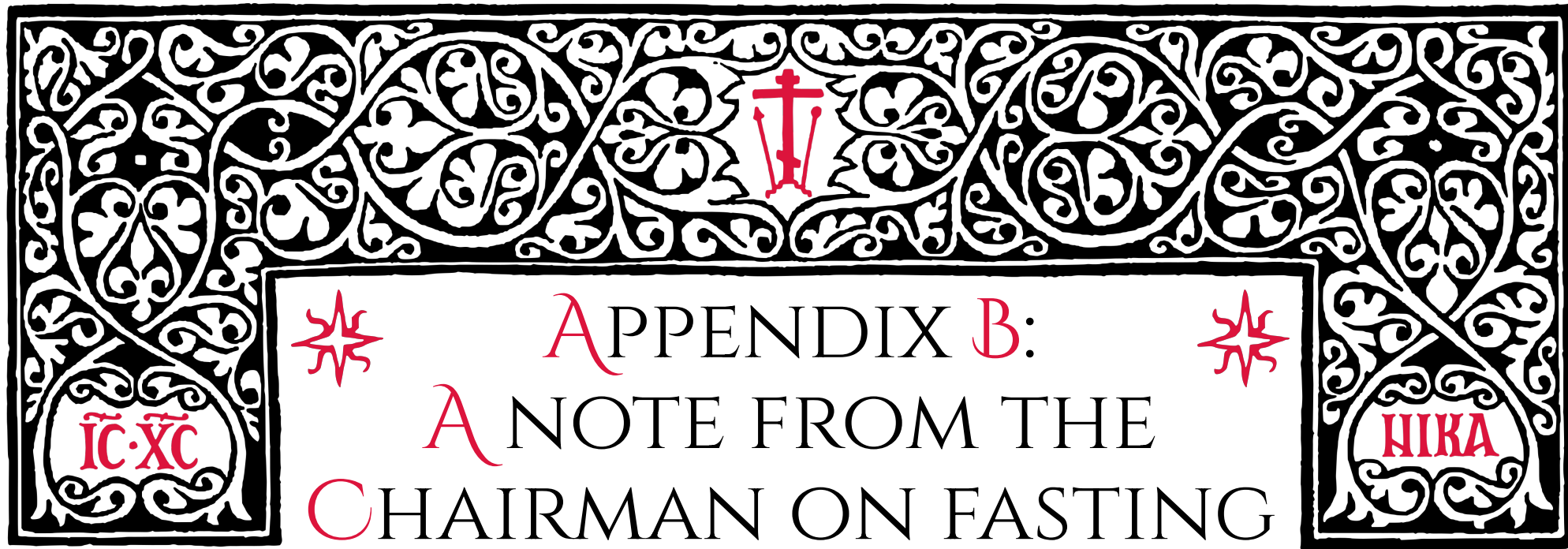
§ 4. On all Fridays of the year, except for the occasions of fast-free periods, the Temple Feast, and the Twelve Feasts, one should abstain from meat products and dishes.

§ 5. On all days of fasting and during fast-free periods, the faithful are obliged to refrain from organising and participating in loud parties, weddings, dances, entertainments, and other similar events.

§ 6. Regarding exemption from the obligation of fasting, the following provisions must be observed:

1. the fast-free periods in the UGCC are: from the Nativity of Christ to the eve of the Theophany; from the Sunday of the Publican and the Pharisee to the Sunday of the Prodigal Son; from Pascha to Thomas Sunday; from the Descent of the Holy Spirit to All Saints Sunday;
2. there is no fasting on Saturdays, Sundays, and on celebration of the New Year (31 December to 1 January) and Independence Day of Ukraine (24 August);
3. the following are exempt from any obligation to fast: children under 14 years of age and persons over 60 years of age; the seriously ill; pregnant women; mothers after childbirth and those who are breast-feeding; those who travel (if the travel time exceeds eight hours); those who do manual labour; those who eat from the table of others; the poor who live on alms;
4. in some cases, the local hierarch may exempt from the obligation to fast, encouraging the faithful to perform works of piety and charity.

§ 7. Outside the territory of the major archiepiscopal Church [Ukraine], local customs should be observed in this regard. ✠



It is worth repeating that the fasts are not there to do us down and to make us either spiritually hopeless because of our flaws and failings, or to make us spiritually proud for a job well done. Instead, we are all in this together, and together as the Church we have found that these are ways by which the Holy Spirit renews our faith in us, and lightens our life in Christ. We all fast and pray, and we all say “God be merciful to me, as sinner.” Thus we can all say, “Thy Kingdom come in me, in us, Thy will be done in me, in us, on earth as it is in heaven, according to Thy Word.”

How? A few tips for the fasts of renewal before the great feasts (such as the Advent Fast leading up to the Nativity and the Great Fast leading up to Pascha) which can also be applied in principle to the weekly fasts of the year.

Christian fasting is holistic – its for the health of our body and our soul at the same time. Healthy and mindful eating, sustains and even strengthens spiritual nourishment from the Holy Spirit. Christ worked his miracles not only by prayer but also with fasting; both are human; both are divine.

Abstinence from certain foods and drink is also fasting. You need to eat enough for your mind and body, and the Church never asks you to harm your health in order to fast and pray well.

Fasting is a physical form of prayer by which we lift up our heart and mind to God.

If you are a child or young teenager, or else an older person over 60, the strict rules of fasting do not apply, because you have varying needs as your body and mind develop. It is important not to damage that. Find a way to keep the spirit of the fast. Or substitute something else to abstain from.

The same goes if you have a longer-term health condition – don’t put fasting ahead of how your healthcare and your medication work. If in doubt, consult your priest who will wisely confirm this.

Aside from the weekly abstention from meat and other animal products on Wednesdays and Fridays – or at least Fridays – can we add another day of the week when we eat meat-free or vegetarian, or vegan?

Across the week from Monday to Friday (Saturdays and Sundays are not fasting days), can we take perhaps just one normal-sized meal a day? The ancient Christian practice is to fast from waking to a single early evening meal. Try not to think you can load your three square meals a day into one banquet! This defeats the object of a little discipline and self-denial, for fine-tuning the mind and soul to receive the graces of the Holy Spirit.

There is never to be any abstinence from water. We significantly restrict the consumption of alcohol. Some people like to follow the monastic rule of refraining from food prepared in oils, in preference for plain or boiled foods.

It’s not only food intake that we can moderate. We have other behaviours that can be self-indulgent and block us off from being open to the spiritual life in Christ. What are my besetting sins and habits that get in the way? Can I do without them at least for this fortnight?

If you can – look at it this way – as an act of joy and love and thanksgiving to Christ our God who sacrificed all for our sake – (i) moderate your food, wine and oil intake (including other alcohols); (ii) add to your abstention from meat on some extra days; (iii) explore delicious vegan food; (iv) enjoy Saturdays and Sundays but keep to the spirit of the fast that in some ways less is more; (v) don’t soldier on miserably on your own – “all one Body we”: we are in this together and “God loves a cheerful giver”; (vi) if you are living or eating with others who do not fast in this tradition, don’t impose your practice on them, although they may enjoy some of our recipes: proper “fast food”; (vii) if you are a guest at a meal – eat what is put in front of you, and don’t fret, or look pained, or disapproving: this is a gift to you from God; (viii) in all things rejoice – this is all about love for Him who first loved us. *Fr.
